



VACATION WATCH

The Lansing Police Department provides a free vacation watch service to residents of the Village of Lansing. When you are away from home for an extended period of time (4 to 30 days), you may request a vacation watch. When your home is listed with the Lansing Police for a vacation watch, patrol officers will periodically stop and check on your home. Officers may walk around your home to see if there has been any attempt forced entry or damage. Although this is not a guarantee that your home will not be damaged or burglarized, it gives you some added piece of mind. We strongly encourage you to make arrangements with family members, friends or neighbors to also check on your home.

Program Qualifiers:

If you meet the criteria below and wish for a vacation watch to be conducted at your home, please fill out the attached form and return it to the Lansing Police Department no later than 7 days prior to your departure. To qualify you must:

- Live in the Village of Lansing
- Be a single-family home (no apartments, condos, or townhouses)
- Be out of town for a minimum of four consecutive days, but not more than 30 days
- Be unoccupied during the time of the watch
- Homes that are vacant for the purpose of possible sale are not eligible
- A maximum of 4 watches (1 per quarter) may be requested in a calendar year

Vacation Tips:

- Place a “vacation hold” on newspaper and mail delivery. Include the start and end dates.
- If no “vacation hold” ask a neighbor to pick up mail and newspapers. Pick up any items that may have been left in the doorway and mailbox.
- Place interior lights and a radio on timers to give appearance the home is occupied.
- Notify neighbors of your absence and ask them to call the police if they see suspicious activity.
- Arrange for grass to be cut or the snow to be shoveled to maintain the look that you are home.
- Make sure that all entry points to your home are secure, unplug electric garage door opener. Lock any vehicles that are being left at the house.
