LANSING HISTORICAL SOCIETY MUSEUM INVENTORY IS COMPLETE

The Lansing Historical Society is pleased to announce that the inventory process is complete! In January, February, and into the first week in March, we counted the possessions, collections, and property in the museum. This monumental task began just after the Festival of Lights display came to a close.

The volunteers logged a total of 315 man hours on this project! We located, counted, and documented 2423 items in our collection and 195 property items. Several pieces of interest were found that had been long forgotten. In particular some Lansing memorabilia items came to our attention. Those items will soon be on display.

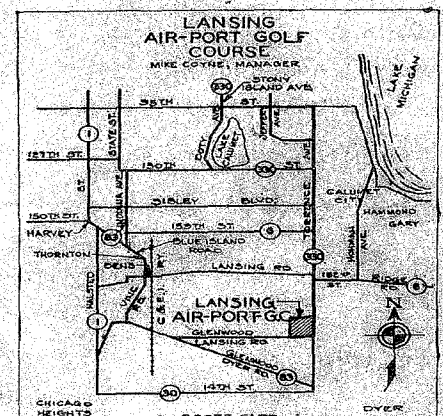

GETTING TO KNOW**A LANSING SOCIETY MEMBER****JOSEPHINE KNUPFER SCHOETTLE****BY ~ MARILYN KOOY**

Josephine Knupfer was born December 31, 1909 in Esslinger Germany. She was one of four children. She came over by boat with her longtime sweetheart, Julius Schoettle, in 1929. They had to have a sponsor in the United States and had to register with the German Consultant before they could come to the States. It took about two years before they could leave Germany.

The ship they crossed on was called the 'Berlin' and it took about seven days to reach Ellis Island. The cost was about five hundred dollars each. They arrived at Ellis Island and traveled by bus and train to Chicago and East Chicago and then Hammond before they settled in Lansing.

Josephine and Julius were married in March, 1931. They had three children, Julius, Mary Lou Gambino, and Kurt. Josephine has 9 grandchildren, 15 great grandchildren, and 1 great great grandchild. Josephine told me that she and Julius loved to dance. When the music started, they were dancing. Josephine and Julius joined St. Ann's church and were very active. Josephine still is very active in the church, where she has been a member for 70 years and is in charge of the hospital ministry.

Josephine and Julius opened their business, "Flowers By Josephine", in 1958 which they operated out of their home on Roy street, where Josephine still lives. "Flowers by Josephine" was opened for 49 years before they closed the doors last year. Josephine was very involved in the Chamber over the years and is part of Lansing's great history.

Josephine is still involved in several organizations. She is one of the original members of the Lansing Business Women's Association and a longtime member of the Lansing Historical Society.

Josephine has received many awards over the years. She was the winner of the Chamber's Athena Award in 2004. She received from the Archdiocese of Chicago, in honor of her 85th birthday, a Special Apostolic Blessing from John Paul II. In September 2005 she received from Francis Cardinal George and the Archdiocese of Chicago, the Christifideles Award for Extraordinary Lay Ministry in the Life of the Church.

Josephine tries to keep herself busy. She still crochets and she tries to attend as many meetings as she can. Most of her family is still in the area, and she loves spending time with them.
