

**VILLAGE OF LANSING
PUBLIC HEARING – APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE
LANSING POLICE FACILITY – 2710 170th STREET
JULY 17, 2018 – 6:50 P.M.**

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Eidam called the Public Hearing to order at 6:50 p.m.

ROLL CALL

Roll call revealed the following Trustees present:
Zeldenrust, Grady Perovich, Hardy, Skrbina, Manno, DeLaurentis

Also present: Village Administrator Podgorski, Village Attorney Welch, various staff and members of the general public.

Mayor Eidam turned over discussion to Village Administrator Podgorski. Podgorski gave a brief summary of the budget, which was presented for the fiscal year ending April 30, 2019 at over \$82 million. Podgorski also recapped the budget for various departments and explained that the appropriation is set at 120% of the operating budget. Podgorski referenced a memo to the Mayor and Board, in which an overview of the budget, including anticipated revenues, new funds, personnel, debt service and capital outlay was given. New revenues include an anticipated increase of 4.8% in the real estate tax levy, a \$5.00 per month increase in garbage rates and a new annual business license fee. Expenditures highlighted were the purchase of a new fire engine and continued upgrades to the computer servers at the Police Department. Treasurer Frye commented on a few highlights, reminding Board members that the budget includes additional revenues that have not yet been passed. Several Trustees thanked Treasurer Frye and the department heads for all their hard work in balancing the budget.

With no further questions or comments from the Board of Trustees, Mayor Eidam opened the hearing up for comments from the public.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Resident, Mr. Bob Malkas, 3553 192nd Street, gave comments regarding the Commercial Operators Concession Agreements at the Lansing Municipal Airport with Midwest Aerospace. He asked if the required annual revenue report from Midwest Aerospace has been submitted, as he has not been able to obtain a hard copy of the report through FOIA requests. Airport manager John DeLaurentiis explained that Midwest has presented a report, however it was never specified that the report had to be in writing.

Mayor Eidam asked if there were any further comments from the public. There were none.

ADJOURNED

Mayor Eidam asked for a motion to adjourn the public hearing at 7:16 p.m. Trustee Manno motioned, Trustee Hardy seconded.
