Below are the activities of the Police Department for the month of April 2019.

911 Center

- The Lansing 911 Telecommunications Center handled 8,171 calls during the month. Of those calls, 4095 were police related and 356 were fire / ems related calls.

Training

- Lt. Hoving attended a Use of Force workshop for supervisors.
- Officer Steven Vierk was hired as probationary patrol officer and is attending the Illinois State Police Basic Training academy class.
- LPD hosted the Retired Police Officer range day for retirees to maintain their certification.
- Probationary Officers Ken Catron, Riley Donnewald, and Tyler Schutt completed the Illinois State Police Basic police academy. All three are now beginning their field training program.
- Officer Talavera-Little attended So. Suburban Emergency Response Training.

Activity

- 298 municipal citations were issued during the month. **(139 citations were issued for Failure to Display Village Stickers).**
- 356 State traffic offenses were cited during the month. These are considered moving violations for speeding, disobeyed stop signs, disobeyed traffic control devices, etc.
- 92 Arrests were made during the month.
- 693 Traffic Stops were conducted.
- 118 Community policing contacts were initiated.
- 37 Abandoned vehicles were located and notice served to the owners.
- 1143 Premise checks were made.
- \$23,000 in administrative fees were collected during the month.
- \$750.00 in Oxcart Truck Permits were collected during the month.

Concentrated attention was provided by the patrol division to abandoned vehicles across town, vehicles speeding on Wentworth Ave. (175th to Ridge Rd.), as well as turning violations on Torrence Ave. during the month.

The first event will be Cop on Roof Top on Friday May 17th from 5:00 am to 12:00 pm at the Lansing Dunkin Donuts 17733 Torrence Ave. LPD personnel will be on hand to collect monetary donations or sell Special Olympics merchandise. The second event will be the Special Olympics Torch run on June 4. The Lansing portion of the run will begin at Glenwood Lansing Rd. and Burnham Ave. at 8:00 am. and proceed northbound on Burnham Ave. until reaching 170th St. where Calumet City P.D. will take over.
